Accomplishments & Outcomes

During FY19, 52% of women and 57% of men completed residential treatment and met all of the treatment milestones, exceeding the national average of 40-44%.

One year after completing residential treatment, 59% of women and 57% of men were still sober and reported an improved quality of life. (For those residents completing treatment in FY18).

In outpatient treatment, 80% of clients admitted to service met or partially met their treatment plan goals during treatment.

A one month follow-up with all clients admitted to our Intensive Outpatient Treatment programs revealed that approximately 98% of those contacted were sober at 1 month post treatment.

Welcomed the 18th drug-free baby born to residents at Oak House and Nevaeh Ridge.

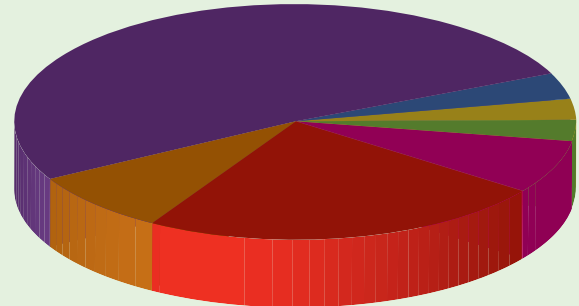
Successfully completed the site survey for our 5th CARF (Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities) accreditation, earning another three year accreditation.

Recognized as 2019 Top Workplaces by The Plain Dealer.

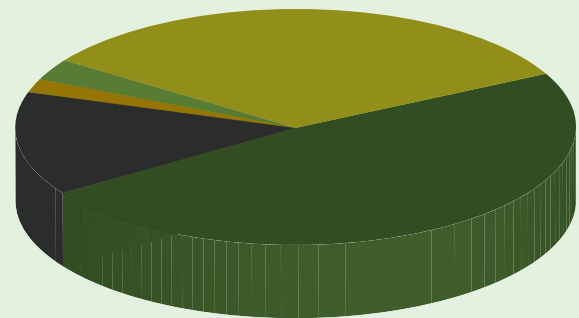
Hired new Chief Development Officer, John Keller, at the end of FY19.
