

During FY21 65% of women and 47% of men completed residential treatment and met all of the treatment milestones, exceeding the national average of 40-44%.



One year after completing residential treatment, 61% of women and 61% of men were still sober and reported an improved quality of life (For those residents completing treatment in FY20).



In outpatient treatment, 73% of clients admitted to service met or partially met their treatment plan goals during treatment.



A one month follow-up with all clients admitted to our Intensive Outpatient Treatment programs revealed that approximately 98% of those contacted were sober at 1 month post treatment.



Welcomed the 30th drug-free baby born to residents at Oak House and Nevaeh Ridge.



Introduced Intensive Relapse Prevention weekend program.



Broke ground for the new men's 16-bed residential treatment facility.



2020 Revenues: \$5,900,000






